To begin to move us toward that goal, I have concluded that we should explore the possibility of using defensive croadilities to counter the threat posed by nuclear ballistic missiles. (0)

I direct the development of an intensive affort to del we a long term research and development program almod at an natically coal of climinating the threat posed by nuclear wallistic unvalidation. These actions will be carried out in a sanner consistent with car obliquitons under the ARM Treaty and recognizing the mond for close consultations with our allies.

In order to provide the necessary basis for this effort. I further direct a study be completed on a priority basis to aspeds the roles that ballistic missile defense could blay in intum security strategy of the United States and our allies. hoose other items, the study will provide quidance becausary on crystap research and development funding commitments for the PT 15 Departmental budgets and the accompanying five-Year Defense Program (FYDP).
