Statement By The Press Secretary

President Clinton signed a Presidential Decision Directive that establishes a new government-wide mechanism to assure the more cost effective and efficient protection of our nation's sensitive information and technologies across all federal agencies and departments. The Directive establishes a Security Policy Board which will become the principal mechanism for reviewing and proposing legislative initiatives and executive orders pertaining to U.S. security policies, practices and procedures. The establishment of this Board, which shall report to the President through the Assistant to the President for National Security Affairs, is needed to 'provide leadership, focus, and direction to the government security communities.'

Mindful of the need for a less costly and more uniform approach to security policy in the Post-Cold War era, the President has charged the Board with ensuring a proper balance is struck between the need for an effective flow of information and the need to protect the confidentiality, integrity, and availability of valuable information. Equally important, the Board must insure that our nation's security polices and practices are fair and equitable in the treatment of all Americans upon whom we rely to guard our nation's security.

Supplementing the efforts of the Board, the President will appoint a Security Policy Advisory Board of five distinguished Americans to provide a non-governmental review of all policies proposed by the Board.

To insure coverage of all **security policies** both here and abroad, the President has also redesignated the current Department of State Overseas **Security Policy** Group as the Overseas **Security** 

**Policy Board.** The Overseas **Security Policy Board** will workto develop and promote uniform **policies**, standards and agreements on overseas **security** operations, programs and projects which affect United States Government civilian agencies represented abroad.
